IMPORTANT DAYS:

- 1. Republic Day: Since 2019, the college is celebrating Republic Day on 26th January. Students and faculties organize flag hoisting ceremonies and cultural events showcasing India's diversity and constitutional values. Debates, quizzes and essay competitions on democracy and legal rights are held to instill a deeper understanding of the Constitution.
- 2. International Yoga Day: Celebrated on 21st June since 2019 every year. Students, Faculties and Administrative Staff of the College by perform different Asanas and Pranayam under the training of a Yoga teacher.
- 3. Independence Day: Since 2019, the college is celebrating Independence Day on 15th August with fervour and patriotism. Students and faculties come together for flag hoisting ceremonies, singing the national anthem and reciting patriotic poems. Special lectures/discussions are organized to educate and inspire.
- 4. Teachers' Day: Celebrated on 05th September since 2019 every year to acknowledge and celebrate the invaluable contributions of educators. It is a day to honour their dedication, hard work and the positive impact they have on shaping individuals and society.
- 5. Gandhi Jayanti: Since 2019, the college is celebrating Gandhi Jayanti on 02nd October. Students and faculties come together to honour Mahatma Gandhiji's principles of non-violence and truth.
- 6. Rashtriya Ekta Divas (National Unity Day): Since 2019, the college is celebrating Rashtriya Ekta Diwas on 31st October., the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. Students and faculties engage in activities promoting communal harmony and understanding among diverse communities through awareness campaigns.

- 7. Samvidhan Divas (Constitution Day): Since 2019, the college is celebrating Constitution Day on 26th November. Students and faculties organize seminars and discussions on the importance of the Constitution in shaping legal systems.
- 8. Human Rights Day: Since 2019, the college is celebrating 10th December. Guest sessions or a visit to Maharashtra State Human Rights Commission is organized for the students.

- 4. Student Engagement: Encouraging participating on Moot Court Competitions, Debates & Essay Competitions centered on Constitutional themes.
- 5. Collaboration with other Law Colleges/Universities: Collaborating with other Colleges through MOUs to organize activities on Constitutional values.
- 6. National Celebrations that align with the spirit and principles enshrined in the Constitution: "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav" and "Kargil Diwas" though not directly a part of the Constitutional values but are significant national celebrations that align with the spirit and principles enshrined in the Constitution.
